## Snack Bar Policy

El Segundo Girls Softball provides a fun, competitive and enriching opportunity for approximately 300 girls each year. Our registration fees are among the lowest in California and the costs of running our program are substantial. A significant portion of each year's operating budget comes from our "snack bar" operations at the Girls Softball Field during the regular season. Therefore, it is crucial to our program's success that the snack bar be well run and consistently staffed.

Part of the obligation of each parent having a child/ren in the El Segundo Girls Softball program is to work in the snack bar in accordance with the schedule distributed by the Team Parents from the Team Parent Coordinator. Snack bar shifts are **mandatory** for all parents. We consider this obligation so important that, in addition to the registration fee, the league requires a snack bar deposit fee of \$75.00 per player to insure compliance with each parent's snack bar obligation. If, at the end of the season, a parent has complied with that parent's snack bar obligation, the fee will be returned. If a parent fails to meet his or her obligation, the fee will be forfeited to the league. Please note that merely "showing up" does not mean that the obligation to work in the snack bar has been met. Meeting the obligation means actually working in the snack bar during the assigned shift without distraction or other interference. In the past we have had difficulties, for instance, with parents sending unqualified persons or unauthorized minors (under the age of 16) to work their shifts or bringing very young children into the snack bar during their shifts. This will no longer be allowed. A minor (under the age of 16) must be authorized by the Team Parent Coordinator in order to work the snack bar. Two minors are not allowed to work the snack bar during the same shift. The determination as to whether a parent has fulfilled their obligation to work in the snack bar will be left to the reasonable discretion of the Team Parent Coordinator and/or Board of Directors.

If for any reason a parent has difficulty with an assigned shift or is unable to make a shift (except, of course, due to extraordinary circumstance), it is that parent's obligation to notify the Team Parent and it is that parent's responsibility to make sure that the shift is covered. Failure to work your required shift/shifts will result in the forfeit of you snack bar deposit.

Thank you for your cooperation and acknowledgment of this policy and your willingness to contribute to the success of El Segundo Girls Softball.
